Reality Gives is a community-based education NGO founded in Mumbai's Dharavi (one of Asia's largest slums and home to over a million people) and now also active in Sanjay Colony, a slum community in New Delhi. We envision a world where underprivileged communities have equitable access to opportunities and

resources, and believe education is the most powerful tool people can use to break the cycle of poverty. Through our school, youth and sporting programs, Reality Gives has reached over 9000 children and young adults since 2009.

OUR COMMUNITIES


DHARAVI

Lying in the centre of Mumbai, Dharavi is comprised of over 80 settlements across 1.7 km² and is home to an estimated 1,000,000 people. This makes it 20 times denser than the rest of Mumbai, which is already one of the most densely populated cities on the planet.



Contrary to its reputation as Mumbai's 'Shadow City', it is an area vital to the day-to-day functioning of the city. It is a slum unlike any other, recycling 80% of Mumbai's plastic and home to an industrial sector which produces around thirty billion rupees (six hundred and sixty-five million dollars) of goods annually. Dharavi's residential sector is home to people from across India – a population which speaks 30 languages and practices more than six different religions. Reality Tours and Travel aims to highlight the ingenuity, enterprise and resilience of this incredible place while Reality Gives seeks to address some of the major challenges faced by its residents.





OUR COMMUNITIES

SANJAY COLONY

Sanjay Colony is a small slum built on 25 acres (0.1 km²) of land near New Delhi's Okhla Industrial Area. It is home to approximately 50,000 people in a city where more than 45% of the population live in slums.



Although it is much smaller than Dharavi, the same widespread spirit of determination to break the cycle of poverty exists. Though the community faces many challenges, its burgeoning clothes recycling and manufacturing industry stands out among a variety of enterprises and small-scale businesses – with few resources available, Sanjay Colony has developed a successful micro-economy. Reality Tours and Travel began offering tours in Sanjay Colony in 2016, which allowed Reality Gives to expand our mission and start providing quality education in a second location. We believe people from underprivileged communities across India (not just Dharavi and Sanjay Colony) deserve the same, and our ambition is to help even more cities as we grow.





OUR APPROACH

Quality contextual education for children and youth is lacking in urban slum communities, especially sustainable interventions lead by community members. The 'three pillars' which form the basis of our work are designed to address this problem: designing and using contextual curricula that is relevant to our students' real-life experiences and needs, hiring our team members from the community, and offering them quality, in-

house training opportunity. We are proud of the fact that the vast majority of our teachers and operational staff come from the communities they now serve, and hope this will lead to a sustainable channel of benefits including a reduction in gender inequality, thanks to our 100% women powered teaching team, and a marked improvement in young people's access to quality education.




YOUTH EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

The Youth Empowerment Program (YEP) Team supports youth aged 16 and above in their educational and personal journeys. We provide the team with a combination of trainings focused on teaching techniques and personal development, to equip them with the confidence, skill-set, and best practices they need to empower our students. In 2018-19 the team received a total of 260 hours of training, ranging from dedicated English sessions with volunteers from the UK, independent lesson planning, vision setting, writing a personal narrative, and brainstorming solutions to global issues such as the refugee crisis

SCHOOL PROGRAM

At our School Program education is a combination of Academics, Values, and Exposure, and our goal is to develop empowered young people who have a well-rounded personality and are caring, imaginative, sensitive individuals. To facilitate this, our team received 122 hours of training focused on teaching techniques and personal development training throughout 2018-19. It focused on classroom management, lesson planning, pedagogy, and behaviour with topics such as how to build a positive classroom culture for learning, data analysis of assessments to enhance lesson planning, reading strategies, parental engagement and nurturing 21st-century skills for our students.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

Active in Dharavi (Mumbai) & Sanjay Colony (Delhi)

Comprised of our English, Life Skills and Computer courses, we deliver our Youth Empowerment Program in Mumbai and New Delhi. It is aimed at participants aged between 16 and 35, who enrol mainly for one of three reasons:

- 1. They attended schools where English was not taught or was very basic. When they finished and wanted to proceed to further education they found it difficult as the majority of the colleges teach in English.
- 2. They dropped out of school at an early age and struggled to find a job. They see proficiency in English, life skills and computers as being key to giving them improved access to job opportunities.
- **3.** Many young women join our program as they want to enhance their status in their (or their husband's) family, by showing that they are educated. While they may not be able to access further education or pursue a career, these skills are important for their self-confidence and self-worth, and enable them to assist their own children with their education

SCHOOL PROGRAM

Active in Dharavi (Mumbai)

When it comes to primary education, high pupil to teacher ratios, a shortage of infrastructure and poor levels of teacher training are widespread in the world's most underprivileged areas. Teaching content and methods must also be improved – the 'rote method', which revolves around repetition and recall of facts, words and sentences without digesting and thinking about information, is still common. Working with 16-to-35-year-olds in our Youth

Empowerment Program we have seen first-hand how a lack of quality primary education negatively impacts one's career, further education opportunities and also sense of self-confidence and self-worth. Our School Program goes to the root cause of this and aims to give primary aged students the strong foundations from which they can grow and develop into confident, educated, empowered individuals.

EXTRACURRICULAR PROGRAM


Active in Dharavi (Mumbai)

In underserved and densely-populated areas, there is little opportunity or space for young people to play. With this in mind, we supplement our formal education programs with a combination of sports, arts and workshops to teach

the types of skills that can't be taught in a classroom alone. Through these activities we aim to develop talents, interests and passions as well as teaching practical skills.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM | Functional English







In our communities, English is widely seen as an important skill for improving employability and subsequently, quality of life. We provide English lessons from Level 0 to Level 3, delivered in 2 hour sessions, in both Dharavi and Sanjay Colony for students 16 years +, 5 days a week for 2-3 months per batch (depending on English level). The syllabus covers the basics of English in reading, writing, listening and speaking and is taught through a variety of techniques contextualised to the local environment with the aimto give learners the confidence to use English in both their daily life and employment. In 2018-19 we introduced an additional Level 0 Warm Up

class for those students who needed to learn the basic skills such as holding a pen and the alphabet. The teams further ensured feedback was collected from each student to better understand how we can continually improve our teaching. In addition, 2 further teachers were hired and trained in Dharavi to teach Level 0, Level 1 and Level 3 English. Certified students were also taken on educational exposure visits in both Mumbai and Delhi, as a fun group activity where they could also gain more knowledge about the areas visited and to celebrate their achievements.



YOUTH EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM | Computer Skills









Practical knowledge and understanding of computers are also seen as vital skills for accessing improved employment and education opportunities. Delivered through 1.5 hour classes in both Dharavi and Sanjay Colony, 5 days a week, totalling 42 lessons over a 3 month period our bespoke Practical Computer Program covers MS Office 2016 programs and the basics of Windows and the internet, which students learn through practical tasks such as CV writing, becoming familiar with Word and Excel and

creating their own PowerPoint presentations (which they then deliver to an audience composed of their teachers, peers and other guests). This program is available both through the Youth Empowerment Program and as a standalone course for other students who are 13 years and above. On completion of the course and clearing the final assessment the students receive a certification and we celebrate their achievements.



The third and final component of our Youth Empowerment Program is Life Skills, which was also developed internally using a blend of Indian and international experts, with local understanding and sensitivity toward culture, religion and traditions at its core. The course covers topics as wide-ranging as gender and equality, personal development, sexual education, interview techniques, body language, personal grooming and etiquette. Through this we aim to give the youth from our communities the knowledge, tools and support they need to overcome some of the issues and

challenges they face. Given the sensitive nature of many aspects of this course, it is taught in Hindi, enabling students to fully articulate their thoughts and feelings. While employability and further education are vital to the future of our students, so too is a pride in who they are, where they are from and the confidence and belief in themselves to be able to be an active and empowered member of society. In 2018-19 we conducted a number of workshops both internally and with external providers who are specialists in their field, giving our students a wider exposure.



SCHOOL PROGRAM





Reality Gives runs a School Program in partnership with a privately-owned low-income school in Dharavi. Supporting the primary education from Junior Kindergarten to Grade 4, with 26 teachers hired and trained form the local community. We hired an Assistant School Leader, a Teach for India fellow, in 2018-19 to support our School Leader in running the school and further develop the teachers. A further partnership was developed with Gati who conducted a school wide review on inclusivity and provided us with training on how to create a conducive classroom environment in school where all students can learn. Training remained an important focus for this year conducted internally by both our Program and


Education Director and School Leaders. Our teachers also were able to attend external training at the Avasara Academy in Pune to learn about the integration of values and skills whilst teaching and also the Kids Education Revolution hosted by Teach for India to learn how students can be developed as community leaders. Our Project Day was special this year; with a focus on the community we work in, the children explored different solutions to problems they see in Dharavi itself, such as the desalination of water. With an incredible attendance from all our supporters they witnessed first hand the confident, curious and caring children we are supporting in their growth and development through the school program.



EXTRACURRICULAR PROGRAM

Girls' Football Academy

Girls in our communities often do not have exposure or the opportunity to play sports, they are often taken out of education early, marry young and there are few facilities available to play sport through school. Our Girl's Football Academy runs for Under-12's, Under-14's, Under-16's and 16 Years and above with training sessions every Saturday and Sunday. It provides a platform to develop their fitness, team-working skills and even learn more about nutrition in a safe space, the football sessions are about more than just sport. Certificates are provided to the players for attendance, skills and practice development to encourage engagement, improve their confidence and instill


pride in their achievements. Through the German Consulate we were able to provide the girls with a new sports kit this year and a select few players were even able to attend an event dedicated to women's football, "She Plays All Win" hosted by the Indo-German Chamber of Commerce, whilst testing their skills against other players from all over Mumbai The final ceremony to mark the end of the Football season is always filled with a great deal of enthusiasm, reflection on how much they have improved over the year and speeches from both the players and coaches before each student is awarded with a final certificate.

Cricket Academy








The Reality Cricket Academy which runs in partnership with Project Front Foot, offers training provided by coached from HB Sports to Under-12s, Under-14's and Under-16's with practice sessions taking place in both the mornings and evenings, three times a week. With the founder of Project Front Foot, Vic Mills coming to Mumbai for a month to observe the program it was a privilege as always to have him with us for his annual visit after 10 years of him starting the program with Reality Gives. With a focus on different skills and team building, the training sessions further develop the players in their

overall confidence. Players are awarded with certificates for attendance, skill and practice development to recognise their efforts and achievements throughout the season. The German Consulate provided brand new kits for the players this year which were distributed at the beginning of the season. Participation in the annual 'Friendship Cup' was a key match again in 2018-19 and the team members all received medals following the match with special recognition given to 'man of the match' and the best in each skill.



EXTRACURRICULAR PROGRAM | Special Activities





Through valued collaboration with national and international partners we provided a variety of special activity workshops and classes at our Community Centres in Dharavi and Sanjay Colony, ranging from dance sessions run by Danceworx Academy to yoga classes led by the Health Living Studio and career ready workshops conducted by Antarang. A amall group of

students were also exposed to the world of photography with workshops conducted in Dharavi itself by photographer, Kiran Ambwani, who had come all the way from Canada. Learning about the functionality of the camera and the importance of composition, the students came away from the workshop with great enthusiasm and a new skill!


